IMANI HOUSE's mission is to "to assist low-income youth, families, and immigrants to create sustainable neighborhoods where residents are decision makers who take responsibility for the improvement of their lives and surroundings." Providing skills, information and opportunity Imani House has joined the rest of the world, meeting challenges head on and succeeding where success is most important; assisting youth and families meet their needs and fullest potential through the provision of education, health and other support programming. Over the past year IMANI HOUSE has had many successes. Some highlights include:

NEW YORK

- The agency held its first ever summer camp under the DYCD OST initiative. P.S. 9 housed the summer program, which accommodated 120 children and was a huge success. Children were able to participate in zumba, karate, arts and crafts and much more as well as attend several trips to places including miniature golf, the Bronx zoo and other fun, interesting places.
- Imani House received funding from both Con Edison and State Farm for its Afterschool program. Con Edison contributed to the afterschool STEM initiative, while State Farm made funds available for our High School Preparedness project.
- Our Walk-To-Live, was held on June 23rd in Prospect Park as planned and was very successful. In attendance we had over 300 children and families walk with us and received support and volunteers from Boing Boing, Harbor Fitness, Kingsbrook Jewish Medical Center and many more; Brooklyn Borough President Marty Markowitz was in attendance and awarded Imani House with a proclamation for the wonderful work we have accomplished. The event was also covered by NY1 news, which sent reporters to interview the Executive Director and attendees. Planning is underway now for our 2014 Walk-To-Live.

LIBERIA

- With help from Minister Nyeswah, Assistant Minister of Health the Imani House Clinic was able to purchase and install solar panels to power the facility. This move on our part will cut cost immensely as gas is a very expensive commodity in Liberia, and prior we utilized only generators. We also were able to dig a new bore hole well and purchase a pump with help from Kofi Woods, Minister of Lands and Mines
- Our sewing initiative sponsored by Friends of Liberia worked with 50 women over the course of the year training them in pattern making, sewing, stitching and other; with the aim of increasing the students' income generating abilities.
- Our Peer Education Project which trains select junior high and high school students on matters of teen pregnancy and prevention, gender and sexuality based violence and HIV/AIDS and other STD prevention trained 20 students who facilitated workshops for over 300 of their peers over the course of the last year.
- Successful continuation of our Childhood and Maternal Health Clinic which serves over 15,000 Liberians annually providing pre and post natal care, vaccinations, basic wound care, treatment of rashes and other infectious diseases, etc.
- Imani House Liberia's Adult Education Program received funding from Proliteracy International for its adult literacy initiatives.
- We continued our partnership with the Liberia Ministry of Health to train lay Midwives to provide pre, postpartum and prenatal care for mothers and newborns
- Partnered with UNICEF to conduct a polio eradication campaign
